LOCAL STUDENTS GET HANDS-ON CONSTRUCTION EXPERIENCE IN REGIONAL CARPENTRY COMPETITION

On Friday, Jan. 10, more than 50 students from local high schools will show off their skilled trades training in the SkillsUSA Eastern Region Carpentry Competition, hosted by the Inland Northwest AGC.

More than 50 high school students from across the region will showcase their skilled trades training on **Friday, January 10, 2025** at the 2025 SkillsUSA Eastern Region Carpentry Competition, hosted by the Inland Northwest AGC. The competition will take place at the former Triumph Composite facility, 1514 S. Flint Rd., Airway Heights, and the winner will have the opportunity to progress to represent the Inland Northwest at the State and National competitions.

Hosted by the Inland Northwest AGC in partnership with SkillsUSA, the competition will begin at 8:00 AM and consist of a written test, a hands-on technical portion where students will build a structure showcasing their carpentry skills, and a mock job interview led by real construction industry professionals.

Media members are invited to attend the technical portion of the competition, which will take place from 8:30 AM – 11:30 PM. Please email contact if you would like additional details.

All materials necessary to compete have been donated by generous NWAGC members and sponsors and there is no cost for students to enter. Judges are employed in the local construction industry, and Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs from area high schools have been training for several months to prepare their students.
