Welcome to the 21st Annual HUB Build Northwest Awards Competition. This is your chance to be recognized for your outstanding achievements. Awards will be presented during the Inland Northwest AGC Annual Convention on February 6, 2026 at the Davenport Grand Hotel.

The HUB Build Northwest Awards honor AGC members who build the region's most impressive construction projects in a variety of sectors and project sizes. Judged by a panel of project-neutral peers, winners will be selected based on project uniqueness, innovation and overall job excellence, among other criteria. Winners will be recognized during a special Awards Luncheon at the Annual AGC Convention. So, put your best to the test and enter your projects today!



PUT YOUR BEST TO THE TEST

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The competition is open to all current dues-paying members of the Inland Northwest AGC for projects completed between **November 2024 and October 2025.** All parties of a joint venture MUST be AGC member firms.

Nominations must be submitted by principals or officers of firms, or with their permission. Different phases or elements of the same project may be entered independently, but not combined as another total project entry.

All projects must be located within the Inland Northwest region (Eastern Washington, North Idaho, Northeast Oregon and Western Montana.) The Out-of-Area Category may be used for any type of project outside this region.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All entries must be submitted in both electronic and print format. Upon receipt, award entries become sole property of the Inland Northwest AGC and will not be returned to the entrant.

PRINT VERSION: 1 complete hard copy must be submitted including color photos. This copy will be used to format the .pdf package put together for judging.

ELECTRONIC VERSION: must be sent in addition to your hard copy. A .pdf version of the submittal with entry forms and color photos is required.

PHOTOS: All entries must include high resolution color photos submitted on a thumb drive or Drop Box. Photos should highlight the construction process and the finished product, including special techniques or unique conditions.

SUPPLEMENTALS: Entries may also include: slides; videos (of no more than eight minutes); media coverage; and letters of recommendation.

REQUIRED MATERIALS & CONTENT

Project submittals must include the following

- 1. A one-page summary describing WHY the project should receive a Build Northwest Award.
- 2. Completed entry form (enclosed).
- 3. Project narrative addressing items A E below. You are encouraged to use the Word (doc) or pdf file format to turn in your application.
 - The narrative should not exceed 5mb in size
 - No scanned narratives allowed.
 - The narrative is limited to 10 pages (for projects of less than \$10M) or 20 pages (for projects of \$10M or more).

Use additional pages (page limits above) to address the topics upon which the projects will be judged:

- A. Difficulty in construction resulting from design, location, materials, etc.
- B. Unusual construction techniques involved
- C. Final appearance and quality of the finished product
- D. Timeliness of completion
- E. Company's safety performance on this project
- 4. Supplier Projects must only complete the Supplier Application form no additional narrative is required.





PROJECT CATEGORIES

Awards will be considered for new construction and renovation work in the categories of:

Building - Your completed project is a traditional building that may include office buildings, hospitals, schools, libraries, museums, multifamily housing and others. There will be two award categories for building; projects under \$10 million and projects \$10 million and over.

Highway & Transportation - Your completed project includes highways, bridges, airports, lane expansions, interchange improvements, new interchanges or alignments, overpasses, pedestrian bridges, road tunnels, transit and railroad projects.

Heavy & Utilities - Your completed project was related to water and wastewater, underground utility, site preparation and other types of public works construction such as public facilities, gas, water, sewer or electrical; or any industrial plant construction.

Sub-Contractor - Your company was not the prime contractor on the project. The entire project does not need to be completed to submit your portion of the project for an award.

Supplier - Suppliers play a significant role in the completion of a successful project. The entire project does not need to be completed to submit your portion of the project for an award.

Out of Area - Your project was completed outside the Inland Northwest AGC territory as defined in the General Requirements. This category will include all types of construction.

Small Projects - Your completed project costs totaled less than \$2 million. This category will include all types of construction and is limited to General Contractors only.

Special Projects - Your completed project does not qualify under one of the above categories.
